# Parasols – symbols of the sun



irginia Conte of Bargara doesn't like wearing a hat and why should she? With her beautiful collection of parasols for protection from our harsh sunlight she does't need one, nor does she wear any sunscreen.

(According to a study by scientists in Nagoya Japan, parasols can provide a 30% drop in the intensity of solar radiation.)

"Whenever I visit a store I check to see if they have parasols and if they have one I like, I buy it," said Virginia who was born in Rome; moved to Australia in 1959, living in Sydney, Mackay and for 12 years in Bundaberg.

The once little girl who remembers hiding during wartime in the mountains of Italy, is an accomplished belly dancer and dress-maker – and her collection of parasols continues to grow.

The earliest parasol-like item is depicted in the art of Ancient Egyptians from the 5th Dynasty, 2450 BC.

In Buddhism the parasol symbolises "a canopy of the heavens' shelter and protection"; a symbol of the sun, whereas the umbrella is a symbol of rain.







# Poetry is like a painting — only with words

Associate Professor Kees Nydam, Clinical Director Of Addiction Medicines Services at Bundaberg Hospital recently spent a week at UK's Oxford University at a Residential Master Class in Creative Writing.

He said most universities, including Cambridge and Harvard hold these classes in semester breaks with participants from all over the world.

"I chose Oxford due to Christ Church College featuring in the Harry Potter films which my children loved, also reading all the books", he said. "Some scenes were filmed directly at the College, others exact replicas including The Great Hall where the characters ate. I was hoping to see Professor Dumbledore but instead caught a glimpse of Snape."

Kees' Dutch parents had been denied education as teenagers during the wartime German occupation of Holland, and were determined their own children have the best chances possible.

"They made great sacrifices to ensure we had the higher education they'd been denied. My father asked what career I was interested in and I replied "A poet, musician or rock star" - the blood completely drained from his face," said Kees who had been attracted to the creative arts all his life.

Born in Sydney and spending early childhood in PNG Kees then attended elite, results driven Sydney's St Josephs, winning a Commonwealth Scholarship to the University of NSW, studying medicine.

In 1999 he brought his own family to Bundaberg, having spent time here in 1977 as an Intern.

"I continued to write poetry and songs throughout my career; in medicine you see some ugly things, the worst and the best of humanity and writing gave me a sense of balance," he said. "To me poetry is like painting but using words; you have this blank page, you get an idea, throwing words at the canvas, it becomes a huge piece of clay you mould into shape – a very cathartic process."

For the past three years Kees has been working on *Shelagh*, *Warrior*, *Healer*, having written the narrative and song lyrics, currently in collaboration with Bundaberg multi-instrumentalist Jason Boving recording the musical numbers.

Kees said the Oxford Master Class was a tremendous help in writing the actual dialogue of the characters and song lyrics.

"The lyrics of a song are exactly the same as poetry – it's like falling in love with the lyrics."

His published work *Poems And Other Fairytales* can be found on the booktopia website.

# Ain't No Mountain High Enough

ike the old Marvin Gaye song says, Kelly Banno and Valda McLeod of Kelly's Coffee/Food/Juice Cafe at Burnett Heads who have conquered an impressive list of mountain peaks, say the higher the climb, the better the view.

They began climbing on December 28 2020 as a "spontaneous adventure".

We put some questions to the courageous climbers.

#### Q. Which peaks have you climbed?

A. Mt Walsh, Mt Coolum, Mt Ngungun, Mt Cooroora, Woowonga, Borumba, Wild Horse Mountain, Mt Coochin (east and west peaks) Beerburrum, Tibrogargan, Mt Perry, Mt Tibberoowuccum, Mt Larcom, Walshs Pyramid, Coongarra Rock, Mount Bartle Frere.

#### Q. Hardest one so far?

A. Valda explains "they all vary with degrees of incline and decline, terrain, weather, distance etc. I don't rate them as "hard"; we just push through, more a matter how we fare physically and mentally after each climb.

Beerwah descension did it for me; I nearly cried when we got down but wouldn't say it was physically hard. The 14 hours up and down Mt Bartle Frere, the highest in Queensland, caused us to lose our big toenails! The powerful force used by our boots in those 8 hours of descension had our nails saying "Had enough!"

#### Q Do you have more planned and when?

A. Always another adventure on the horizon, we don't have to drive far to get to climbs, definitely keen on the Scenic Rim, NSW border and Mt Warning - the list goes



"There's no time for fear, you just push through to get to the top and safely down. We rely on each other. If I'm too short Kel will boost me up and if she needs help I'll attach a rope somewhere so she gets the added assistance to get over a hurdle."

Valda moved to Bundaberg in 2009, joining Kelly in the Cafe in 2018.

"We've taken our children climbing a few times but they're not keen, let's hope they get the bug later as they grow.

I've taken other people up, including teens and their sense of achievement upon completion is unbelievable."

"We even took a 71 year old friend who

has emphysema up and down Walsh, taking 5 hours, stopping every few steps for him so he was able to tick that off his bucket list". The Golden Rule

Valda's advice for novice climbers - "always take plenty of water as you need it more for the ascension, take food to fuel your body as you'll be starving at the top. Travel with at least one other in case you slip or something -safety first, always!

And always have 3 points of contacts at all times - that's the golden rule."





# Bundaberg historian's new book – race relations in our region

y generation was taught almost nothing about Australian history apart from convicts, explorers and 'riding on the sheep's back' with never a mention of the role or fate of the original Australians, least of all those in my own district," said Margaret Slocomb.

Margaret earned a Ph.D in history and as education specialist spent most of her professional career in the East and Southeast Asia, particularly Cambodia. She continues to research and write as an independent scholar.



"When the syllabus caught up a bit in the 70s teachers were only one step ahead of the students when it came to local history. Inevitably a small hand was raised one day 'What happened to the Aborigines Miss?' I told the truth – that I didn't exactly know, but the question nagged me for years afterwards," said Margaret.

Double Vision serves as a prequel to Among Australian Pioneers and the experience of Chinese indentured labourers from 1848 to 1880, a time of conflict.

Her latest book answers a call for more regional histories of earlier times so we can understand the diversity of reactions and responses.

Present Leader of the Opposition, Peter Dutton's great-grandfather Charles Dutton, was a pastoralist and politician from Bauhinia Downs, and Member of the Legislative Assembly in Leichhardt, among numerous other government positions.

He was known to offer shelter and first aid to some badly wounded aborigines after a particularly gruesome reprisal massacre, gaining him the sarcastic title as one of the "Virtuous Colonists".

The Brisbane suburb of Dutton Park was named after him.

The book examines the encounters between new societies seeking profit, and the traditional owners defending their land. It describes brutal affairs conducted beyond regular norms in a framework of conflicting, mutually incomprehensible and irreconcilable laws.

The Wide Bay and Burnett on the tribal lands of Kabi Kabi and Wakka Wakka nations represented that frontier from 1845 until Queensland formed a separate colony in 1859.

#### "That Question"

In writing this book I tried to keep in mind what my young student asked. "What happened to the Aborigines?" I don't know if I have answered her satisfactorily or with the full truth but as far as possible, kept to the facts as they are generally known".

The cover design is an oil on paper work entitled "Double Vision" by Kylie Brislane, a Year 11 student of Kepnock State High School and used with her permission plus that of her teacher and the school.

Cambodia remembered: Other published works include People's Republic of Kampuchea – The Revolution After Pol Pot; An Economic history of Cambodia in the 20th century; Colon and Coolies -development of Cambodia's rubber plantations; Among Australia's Pioneers – Chinese.

Margaret recently appeared on SBS production "Who The Bloody Hell Are We?" speaking about the early Chinese population of the Bundaberg region.

Double Vision published by Balboa Press, is available from Amazon and hopefully Bundaberg Library.

# Kennedy Bridge's prestigious award

BUNDABERG'S Kennedy Bridge has been awarded an Engineering Heritage Marker under the Heritage Recognition Program of Engineers Australia.


Did you know that by using Kennedy Bridge, which links East Bundaberg to the CBD you're driving across an incredible achievement in Australian engineering in service for 124 years.

It was built to replace the former dilapidated timber bridge in 1878. Kennedy Bridge was assessed against several criteria including historical significance, historical individual association, creative and technical achievement, research potential, social, rarity, integrity and intactness.

Modelled on Brisbane's Victoria Bridge, it's now the oldest example of this type of steel bridge design in Queensland since the Victoria Bridge was demolished.

Constructed by John McCormick and Son, the total cost of the bridge's construction was just under £7000.

The bridge was opened on 26 November 1899 by former Minister for Railways and Works, the Honourable J. Murray, who described it as "one of the finest works of its kind he had seen in Queensland".

January – Hatching Season starts as the hatchlings begin to appear and scurry to the ocean with only one in 1000 surviving to come back to Mon Repos to breed. Even though the first babies are hatching, other turtles are still laying their eggs in January.

A popular spot for chuildren on the pathway at Bargara is the Turtle Playground.



Bert Hinkler ... how he flew, where he lived. "Flight ever fascinated me" said Bert who always spelled Aviation with a capital "A" as a little boy at North Bundaberg State School.

Hinkler Hall has a soaring exhibition hall, multi media exhibits, flight simulator, the Globe Theatre, five aircraft and provides a fascinating adventure where you become part of the story.

Your entry to the Hall Of Aviation includes admission to the magnificently restored Hinkler House which he named Mon Repos after our local beach where he practised flying.

In the early 80s, Bert's house was brought back brick by brick from Southampton in

England to stand proudly in the Botanic Gardens.

Bundaberg Historical Museum will fascinate visitors with "how things used to be." Beautifully maintained in the Botanic Gardens, this quaint haven of nostalgia has the famous Lucke Quads' pram, the only one of its kind made in Australia. See an old schoolroom, butcher shop, general store, bank office, hospital (with iron lung) milk cart and horse, even a jail.

# **Bundy's Heritage Walk**

n easy stroll around the CBD shows our rich history.

Former Commercial Banking Company of Sydney, corner Bourbong and Maryborough Streets is colonial style, built in 1891. Wide colonial verandas are embellished with cast iron lace balustrades, a distinctive feature of buildings of that period.

**School Of Arts Building** in Bourbong Street is the oldest public building still standing, built in 1888 and features late Victorian architecture.

**Post Office** building and tower opened in 1890. Ground floor has wonderful pillars and arches and upper floor is dominated by colonial verandas and cast iron balustrades.

**Linden Medical Centre** in Barolin Street was built in 1913 for Dr Schmidt whose father emigrated from Berlin.

It has a time capsule with money and newspapers from the period placed in a wall. The design shows European influence in Queen Anne style and is used as a medical practice.

**Burnett Dental Surgery** a few doors from Linden Clinic, built in 1910 has pressed metal walls both inside and out, and original ceilings. Adornments on the original façade are Dental Blocks, an example of ancient Greek architecture.

**Holy Rosary Catholic Church**, Bundaberg's first, opened on this site in 1875, an adaptation of a Roman temple.

The Anglican Church was built in English Gothic style with 34 metre spire tower with stonewalls, lichgate and way-side cross. Built in 1876 with the present church completed 1927.

"We're all in together," said Greg. "I really love my work, I value the fact that I am able to take care of the patients who need the expertise that we can provide and love doing it for them."




